Dear colleagues,

I hope that you all had a very nice Easter! I also hope that you are energized and ready for the discussions to come at our Solstrand gathering on Monday and Tuesday! As you might have seen in the <u>program</u>, we have quite a number of important and interesting things to discuss, concerning research, education, and outreach.

We have just passed two of the most important deadlines of the year: 10th of April for submitting research proposals to the Research Council of Norway, and 15th of April for receiving applications to bachelor and master studies at all universities and university colleges in Norway. I am extremely pleased to announce that we submitted 14 applications to the Research Council with a project manager from our department! And there will be even more applications to come for the open call of the IKTPLUSS program.



The outcome of the these will not be ready before the end of the year, whereas the number of applicants to our study programs are already out.

This year there has been an unexpected decrease in the total number of applications to higher education in Norway, after a steady increase every year over the past decade. On the positive side, I am really proud to see that our university has actually an increase in its share of the total number of applications, as the only one of the traditional universities. In particular, more than 1000 applicants chose some bachelor program in ICT at our university as their first priority! For our department we notice in particular a clear increase in the number of applications to our bachelor program in information security, and to our master program in informatics with specialization in machine learning. This has also been noticed and remarked by the UiB leadership. I am pleased to see that our efforts to strengthen our research in cryptography and our hard work towards student recruitment has paid off. I would like to thank Ida, PåI, and Liljan for their commitment in this direction; especially the hard work of Ida has been invaluable, and I am really grateful to her. Ida and PåI will present all application numbers for us in detail at Solstrand.

Another current reason to be proud of our university is <u>the recent agreement with Elsevier on open access</u> <u>publishing</u>. Our university leadership, together with NTNU, University in Oslo, and UiT, have managed to negotiate what appears to be a surprisingly good deal! You can read the details <u>here</u>, but in short it seems to imply that we will be able to publish in Elsevier journals as before and our publications will be freely available to everybody. This is a first ever agreement world wide of its kind between academic institutions and Elevier, and a similar agreement has already been reached also with Wiley. Many of us have been quite concerned about the time frame within which all academic publications in Norway are required to be open access. This recent development might indicate that it was perhaps necessary to set a short time frame and strict rules and guidelines. I find it really motivating and inspiring that Norway, and our university in particular, are taking a leading position in producing good solutions for open access dissemination of properly reviewed research results.

I wish you all a very nice weekend, and I am truly looking forward to see many of you at Solstrand on Monday!


Congratulations colleagues

Horizons Lecture 30 April: Professor Rainer Helmig



The service includes helping you to prepare funding applications, setting up and negotiate contracts, and managing your research project. The new webpage is designed to get you started and help you find the right contact persons in our administration, and also contains an overview of relevant funding sources, support for grant applications, research contracts and collaboration agreements and kick-off meetings and operational phase.



The UiB Career Development Program- Momentum is a one year training programme designed to give talented postdocs and associate professors the opportunity to acquire and strengthen their professional skills whilst offering a forum to reflect on the opportunities and challenges working in academia present. The program aims to increase UiBs participation in ERC, FRIPRO Young Research Talents and other relevant calls for proposals for young researchers.

The programme is designed for early career researchers embarking on an academic career at a research university. Postdocs, researchers and associate professors who are employees at UiB are invited to apply. The candidate must be

under the age of 40 or have being awarded the PhD degree less than 5 years ago, not including statutory leaves. Employees on a temporary contract must have a minimum of one year remaining on their contract.

Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions: Research Fellowship Programme

The Individual Fellowship (IF) Programme within the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) is a bottom-up, excellence funding program which aims to support the career development and training of researchers through international and intersectoral mobility. One can apply in two main categories: (i) European Fellowships are held in EU Member States or Horizon 2020 Associated Countries and are open to researchers either coming to Europe from any country in the world or moving within Europe. The researcher must comply with the rules of mobility in the country where the European Fellowship is held.[1] (ii) Global Fellowships are based on a secondment to a third country and a mandatory 12 month return period to a European host. The researcher must comply with the rules of mobility in the country where the Global Fellowship secondment takes place, not for the country of the return phase.[1]; [1] <u>MSCA-IF-2019</u>; Further reading: <u>MSCA-IF general information</u>

Please note that this program is targeting Experienced Researchers, i.e. researchers that at the date of the call deadline are in possession of a doctoral degree or have at least four years of full-time equivalent research experience.

If you have a researcher in mind that could be relevant for one of the two funding schemes and/or are interested in applying yourself, please contact <u>Stefanie.Meyer@uib.no</u>. Early planning is crucial as this is a highly competitive program. **Deadline: 11 September 2019**

NCI Grants for Member University Researchers

The Nordic Centre in India announces the following programmes for researchers at our NCI member universities:

a) NCI Travel Grant: NCI will annually support 6 scholars from member universities travelling to India for the purpose of research with an NCI Travel Grant that covers travel expenses upto 500 Euros per successful applicant.

b) <u>NCI Academic Activity Grant</u>: NCI will be supporting collaborative academic activities between member universities and Indian higher educational institutions through a grant for a max of 3500 Euros per successful application.

c) <u>Ganga Mahal Scholar in Residence Programme</u>: NCI will support one scholar annually from a member university travelling to India for the purpose of research with the NCI Ganga Mahal Scholar in Residence Programme. This programme is in cooperation with Karlstad University and it covers travel costs upto 500 Euros and one month's stay at Karstad University's India Study Centre located in Varanasi.

The **deadline** for receiving applications for this Spring 2019 Call is **15th of May 2019**. A second call will be announced in the Fall of 2019.

Please notice that they are offering one course in English only once per semester. This semester the course in English will be held on 23rd May.




Reminder: Informatics yoga on Wednesdays
